The answer is very simple. When we observe Holy Week, we remember why we need and are blessed to have the presence and saving work of God in Jesus Christ.
There's a difference between people who do and don't understand and seek to observe Holy Week as an intense intentional time for remembering the journey of Jesus Christ to the cross. There's just a difference. You don't need to come to everything we have during Holy Week here at Christ the King and in partnership with the Riverchase Churches Monday thru Friday. But it is very important to set Holy Week aside as Holy in some way, fashion, or another. God calls us to meditate on His Word day and night. Holy Week is a nicely prepared opportunity for you to receive God's blessings through meditating on God's Word, specifically the week of Christ's Triumphal Journey on Palm Sunday, the weekdays leading to Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and the Resurrection Sunday of our Lord, reigning victorious over the power of $\sin$ and death.

I'll always remember the wonderful and joyful testimony of our longtime Christ the King Sister, Libby West, saying, "God is just so good! I remember the words of my sweet Danielle when she led her college roommate to Christ. She said 'my mom and I wouldn't be able to get out of bed each day without Jesus!' Absolutely true and I love to share
that with everyone! Hugs and prayers ." And then when I asked Libby if I could share her
testimony, she replied, "Of course, Pastor Chris! You know, if I am anything, I am an open book, lol.
. I have dealt with a lot of tragedy in my life, but I have learned to recognize how God uses those experiences for my good and
the good of others.
Libby shows us the fruit of both meditating on God's Word daily through the year and specifically observing the days that are the most Holy Week itself, namely, the fruit of knowing that God shares in our sufferings and sovereignly works through all things together for the good of both our joyful salvation and also God's glory through faith in the person and work and clear commands of God's Son, our Savior and Lord, Jesus Christ, including Christ's command to somehow and some way share the knowledge and joy of his redeeming work with everyone we meet.

On the other hand, I once heard a guy who, unlike Libby, has stopped observing Holy Week because he said, "it makes me feel guilty, and besides, Jesus went to the cross to cover God's failings, ya know, God let's other people's children die, so 'an eye for an eye', God has to pay for his failing all those parents and make his son die too."

On the one hand, I was mortified at how that person has totally twisted and now abandoned God's Word, accusing and convicting God of failure.

On the other hand, I was literally moved to tears of thankfulness and joy for people like my dear friend, Libby, who, although she has suffered through the death of her daughter, Danielle, and many other bitter pills in life, continues to testify that being a part of a church and faithfully observing Holy Week is rooted in the confidence that God in Christ is ever faithful in being our strength "to get out of bed each day" and, yes, there's "a lot of tragedy in my life, but I have learned to recognize how God uses those experiences for my good and the good of others."

How do you yourself see difficulty? Observing Holy Week helps us see all things right and well through the lens of the person and saving work of God through God's only begotten Son, our Savior and Lord, Christ Jesus.

Praise God!
Trust and follow Jesus. He gives you power, love, and self-control.

## Establishing A Foundation for Church Safety

## WE MUST BE REALISTIC ABOUT OUR CHURCH ENVIRONMENT!

When people gather for worship, things are rarely as organized as they might be in some other meetings.

People arrive early and late and in groups and alone.
Members and guests may roam around the lobby or wander down halls.
The lobby may be packed with people of all ages.
Our church may not have a greeting area, or it may have a large lobby.
If there is more than one service some people will arrive as others leave.
Our post may be in the sanctuary and focused on seating people, or we may be at the front door or in the lobby, busy with greeting, conversing and handing out materials. In either case, we may not be able to contact every guest.

Our task is to keep these realities in mind as we look for even small ways to plan and prepare for an emergency. We may not have a perfect situation from the viewpoint of safety and security, but we can improve the situation that we have.

WE MUST BE KNOWLEDGEABLE. We need to know what to look for and what to do if we see something of concern. We do not need extensive training to be reasonably effective. Our life experiences and some review and discussion will provide us with most of the knowledge that we need.
